ABSTRACT

The proliferation of digital communication platforms has facilitated the integration of emojis as a form of visual language alongside traditional literary elements such as poetry and narrative. However, the implications and significance of this trend remain underexplored in French electronic literature (French E-lit). This study examines the emerging trend of interweaving emojis, poetry, and narrative in this Context- Specific Field. The aim of this research is to analyze the incorporation of emojis into French electronic literature and investigate how they interact with poetic and narrative structures. The aim of the study is to ascertain the extent to which these symbols contribute to poetic and narrative structures, enriching the reader's experience and broadening the boundaries of traditional storytelling. Since the emergence of smartphones and social media, emojis became more versatile and diverse, evolving into a standardized set of graphical symbols. According to Ajah (2022),

The new media and ICT have dismantled the generic classification of literature, thereby shifting its traditional boundaries, innovating its artistic production and empowering its readership. Among the subgenres of literature, poetry has received the greatest technological innovations that have given rise to digital poetry which is fused with the convergence of text, image and sound. (p.669)

Over time, writers and poets began dealing with the expressive potential of emojis, incorporating them into their literary works as visual elements to complement or substitute for textual content. French authors and creators such as Nicolas Frespech, Ann-Sarah Kertudo, and Christophe Bruno have been at the forefront of this digital literary movement, experimenting with new modes of storytelling, audience engagement, and artistic expression.

In parallel with the rise of digital literature, the usage of emojis has become an integral part of modern digital communication. Emojis, pictorial symbols originally developed to express emotions in text messages, have developed into a universal language used across various online platforms and applications. Arising from simple emoticons to a vast array of graphical representations. Emojis offer a concise and visually rich means of communication, transcending linguistic barriers and conveying nuanced emotions in the digital realm. Similarly, within the context of French E-Lit, a remarkable phenomenon has emerged in recent years, the development of Emoji Poetry and Narrative. This artistic form of expression leverages emojis as essential components of the literary narrative, blending visual and textual elements to create immersive and engaging literary experiences. Emoji Poetry explores new poetic structures, using this form of communication to evoke emotions and build meaning in ways distinct from traditional verse, while Emoji Narrative utilizes emojis as dynamic storytelling tools, blurring the boundaries between written text and visual imagery.

However, several notable poets have evaluated the creative potential of emojis, incorporating them into their poems to add new dimensions of expression and engage with modern readers. They include Fredrik Høyer, Ishion Hutchinson, Sam Riviere, and Morgan Parker. Høyer, a Norwegian poet, is known for his innovative use of emojis in his poetry. In his collection titled *Gjendiktninger* (Reimaginings), he blends traditional poems with emojis, creating a unique form of visual poetry. Høyer's incorporation of emojis adds a playful and contemporary touch to classical poetry, appealing to a tech-savvy audience while retaining the emotional depth of the original verses. In the same vein, Hutchinson, a Jamaican poet and recipient of numerous literary awards, has been recognized for his thought-provoking and experimental approach to poetry. In his poem *Chain*, Hutchinson incorporates emojis to create visual symbolism that complements the poem's themes of interconnectedness and

communication in the digital age. By using emojis strategically, Hutchinson bridges the gap between traditional and modern poetic techniques. Furthermore, Sam Riviere, a British poet, is known for his engagement with pop culture and the digital landscape. His collection *Kim Kardashian's Marriage* incorporates emojis alongside traditional poetic elements, offering a commentary on contemporary society's fixation with celebrity culture and social media. Riviere's use of emojis blurs the lines between the mundane and the profound, adding layers of meaning to his poems. More so, Morgan Parker, an American poet and novelist, explores themes of race, identity, and gender in her works. In her collection *There Are More Beautiful Things than Beyoncé*, Parker uses emojis as a means of subversion and empowerment. By interspersing emojis within her poems, she challenges traditional poetic conventions and invites readers to engage with her work in new and unexpected ways.

The primary objective of this research is to examine Emoji Poetry and Narrative in French electronic literature, seeking to understand and analyze the creative utilization of emojis in this digital literary genre. Through a comprehensive examination of selected works from prominent French authors and creators, the study aims to investigate the ways in which emojis contribute to poetic expression and narrative construction to enhance the reader's experience in novel and innovative ways. 2. Systematic review of previous studies on emoji in digital communication

Auber, O. (2020), examines the emotional expression of Twitter users through emojis and identifies prevalent emotions associated with specific emojis. However, Auber, in his analysis, did not include the ways in which the context in which emojis are used can alter their emotional interpretation in poems. There is a need for research exploring how combining emojis with different textual content in poems may impact users' emotional perceptions and responses.

Joyce (2019), investigates the interpretation of emojis in cross-cultural communication, highlighting variations in emoji understanding across cultures. However, Joyce's study does not consider the impact of these cultural differences on the potential for miscommunication and misunderstandings. Further research is warranted to understand how discrepancies in emoji interpretation might lead to unintended consequences in international communication, both in personal interactions and on a broader scale in global diplomacy.

Moulthrop (2019)'s study examines how emojis are used on Instagram to convey meanings and create visual narratives. However, this study does not evaluate the impact of these visual cues on audience engagement or how they shape users' perception of the content. A research gap exists in understanding how effectively emojis facilitate storytelling and emotional connection on social media platforms, and how their strategic use might influence user behavior and content reception.

InS Strickland (2018)'s study titled *Emoticons, Emojis, and Phishing: The Role of Visual Cues in Email Communication Security*, the study focuses on the security implications of visual cues like emojis in email communication, it primarily examines phishing attacks and user vulnerability. Campbell and Strickland's research leaves a gap in understanding how users' emotional responses to emojis might influence their susceptibility to social engineering tactics in phishing attempts. Premised on the above, further research is needed to ascertain the cultural variations in emoji interpretation, as different cultures may attribute distinct meanings to emojis, impacting their effectiveness in phishing emails.

In Breeze (2017)'s historical analysis, he traces the development of emoticons and emojis in digital communication. However, Breeze M's work focuses primarily on the technical evolution and their adoption over time. A research gap exists in understanding the social and psychological implications of emoji usage in contemporary digital communication. Investigating how emojis influence emotional expression, empathy, and social interactions in modern communication platforms would be valuable in bridging this gap. While previous studies have shed light on various aspects of emoji usage in digital communication, there is a notable research gap that need to be addressed, which our study hinges on. Filling these gaps will enhance an understanding to the multifaceted role of emojis in the evolving landscape of digital poetic communication.

of a new source of love and energy. The arrow pointing to the sparkling heart emoji  reinforces the idea of a renewed heart, sparkling with newfound love and hope.




Example 7

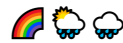
Waves crash and recede,
